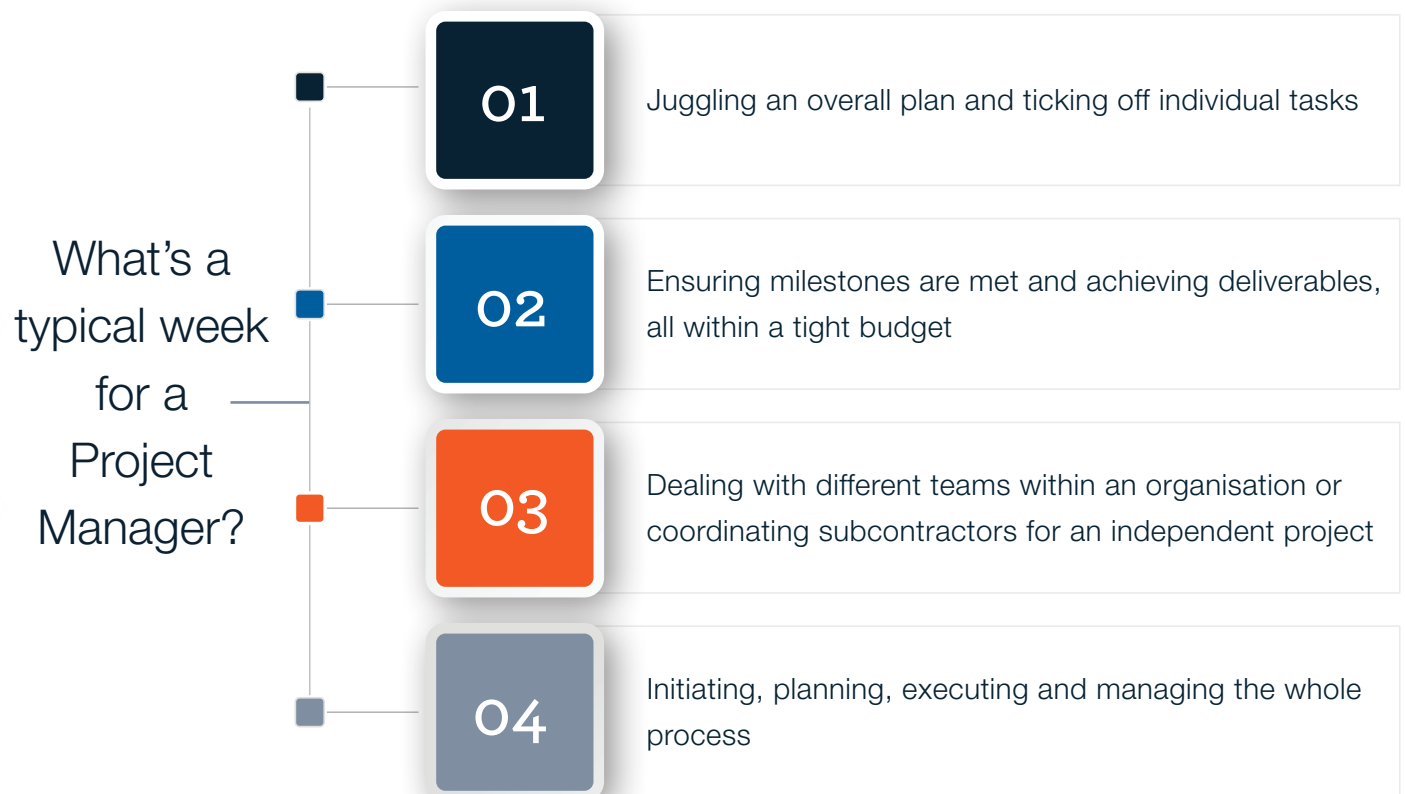

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI)

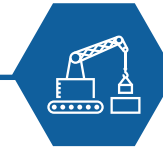
Project Management Trends and Shifts

WHICH INDUSTRIES NEED PROJECT MANAGERS THE MOST?



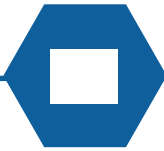
ENGINEERING

The project manager is usually the key liaison between the engineering team and client and are available around the clock. They will discuss risks, deadlines and record all communications.



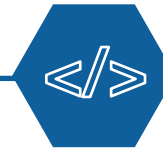
CONSTRUCTION

Responsibilities extend across planning and executing through to project closure. Meeting timeframes and daily monitoring of activities is essential, as is reporting to management and providing support to the client.



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

In addition to standard project management responsibilities, IT project managers must justify the value to the organisation of implementing software and IT systems. Impacts across the organisation and to all stakeholders must be analysed and managed.



SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT

To develop software systems or products, the project management process and software development process must be integrated. Often the needs of multiple end-users must be considered and the software extensively tested before the software release.

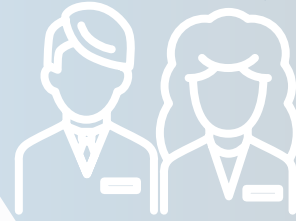


BUSINESS

Project Management Skills

WHAT SKILLS DO I NEED TO BE A SUCCESSFUL PROJECT MANAGER?

Project managers operate in an environment where both technical and soft skills are valued equally. This is due to the need for accurate analysis while dealing with a range of people with different specialties and personalities.

Think of a project manager as the skipper of a large ship that needs to navigate its way through sometimes choppy waters, a job that requires a mixture of technical know-how and thorough understanding of their crew.

TECHNICAL SKILLS

Technical skills are essential to success and achieved with a diploma-level education and experience. Some technical skills crucial for project management are:

- Strategic planning
- Project scheduling
- Financial modelling
- Setting and meeting budgets
- Computer and software literacy
- Meeting facilitation
- Knowledge of required methodologies
- Performance tracking
- Risk assessment, management and planning
- Quality auditing, assessment and management of quality processes
- Overseeing project human resources management functions

SOFT SKILLS

Soft skills are vital to success and can be considered the 'glue' that holds the project management process together. Essential soft skills are:

CRITICAL THINKING AND PROBLEM-SOLVING

These two soft skills are crucial for when project managers are under pressure and dealing with competing interests. It can mean the difference between a project completed on time and to budget and a sub-par outcome for the project.

INTERPERSONAL OVERSIGHT

This is necessary for understanding how to balance the needs of multiple stakeholders over the project lifecycle while working to different timelines and overall budget.

COMMUNICATION AND COLLABORATION

Having these soft skills is critical when dealing with clients and balancing multiple contributors to a project. Ensuring that you communicate effectively and efficiently with your clients and stakeholders allows for improved collaboration between parties.

RISK ASSESSMENT

At every stage of a project's implementation, risk assessment is paramount. This often involves working with a quality auditor or OHS supervisor, evaluating their reports and recommendations to work together for the best solution regarding that project and potential risk.

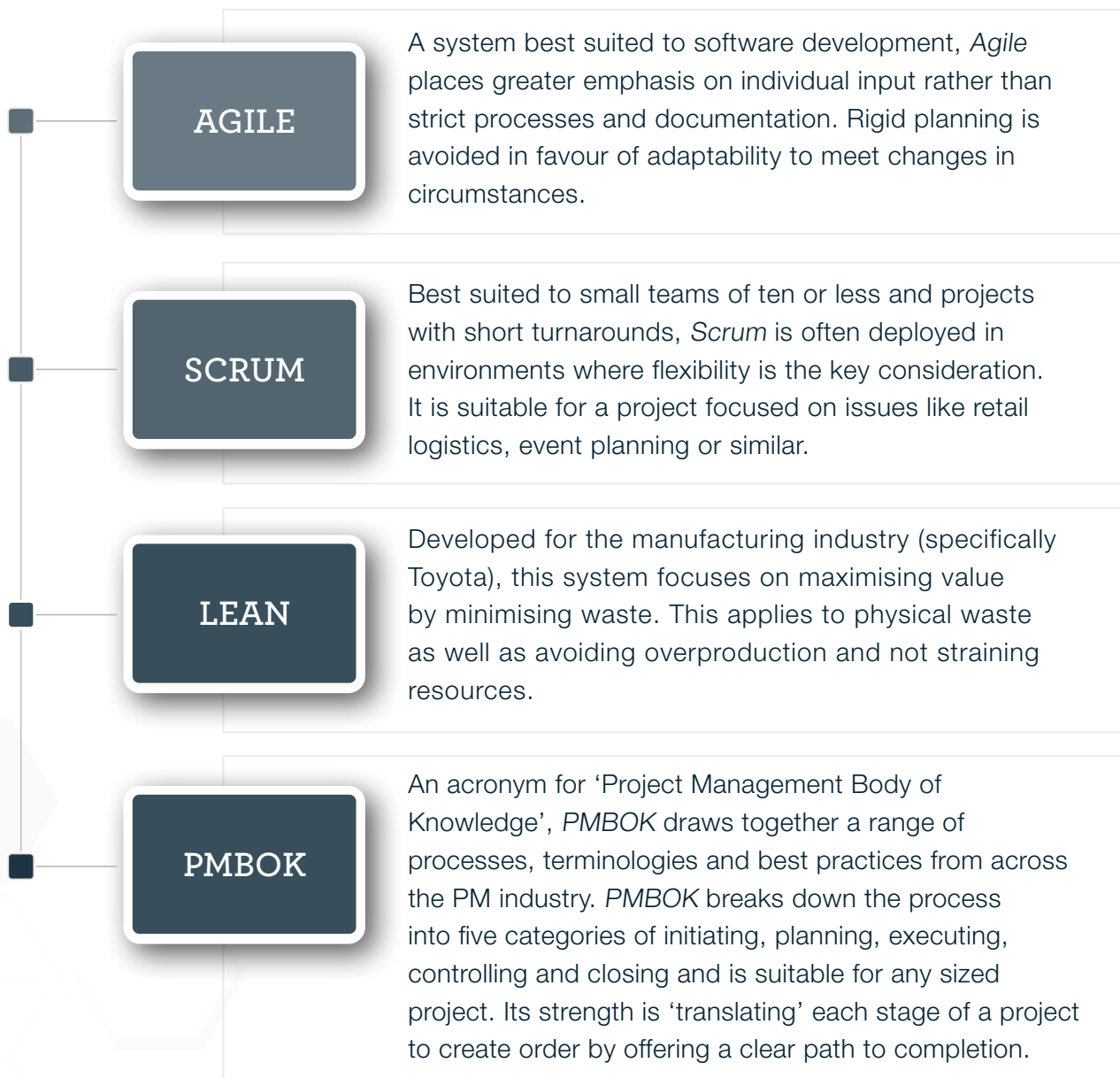
NEGOTIATION

When the client scope changes mid-way, timeframes need to be adjusted, or more funds are required, negotiation is an important skill to have practiced and be confident in as a successful project manager.

RECOGNITION

Where is this qualification recognised?

The College for Adult Learning is a Registered Training Organisation TOID 22228 and all of our Certificate IV and Diploma qualifications adhere to the Australian Qualification Framework (AQF). They are Nationally Recognised and internationally respected qualifications, issued on behalf of the Australian Government.

COURSE STRUCTURE

How is the course delivered?

The course is 100% online and self-paced, so you can study on your own terms. Make your way through the units with clear tutorials, supporting content downloads, as well as regular checkpoints to test and strengthen your learning along the way. You'll complete a combination of quizzes, written activities, and practical assessment tasks to demonstrate your skills.

What are the assessments?

There are no exams for the course. All assessments involve practical and job-ready applications based on your workplace or the case studies we provide. There are different assessment elements, including interactive simulation and role play activities. These activities are conducted with a Learning Coach and may need to be completed with others (e.g. coworkers, friends or family) in real-time through Zoom or in a pre-recorded video. Video assessments allow us to assess your interpersonal skills needed for management roles. This is an innovative method to engage with your learning by acting out crucial situations you would encounter in the workplace, in a safe environment with an industry expert. You'll be able to hone your new skills in real-time with your Learning Coach and get valuable feedback so you can confidently demonstrate your learning in the workplace.

REQUIREMENTS

Are there any prerequisites for the course?

Our students are required to be 18 years or older at the time of registration and demonstrate the required level of competency in English language, literacy and numeracy skills. If English isn't your first language, you may be asked to sit an LLN test to ensure you are suitable to undertake the course.

What IT requirements do I need to complete the course?

You will need regular access to a laptop, desktop computer or another device with an adequate and reliable internet connection, at least the equivalent of Microsoft Office or Office for Mac, with word-processing capabilities and spreadsheets and a PDF reader installed, full permissions to install and access third-party software as required. You will also need regular access to a laptop, desktop computer or device with an adequate camera to undertake video calls for assessments as required.

COURSE STRUCTURE

How long does the course take?

Our courses are completely self-paced, meaning you can study around your lifestyle. No strict deadlines, no inflexible classes to work around, no pressure to work to someone else's schedule. When can I start?

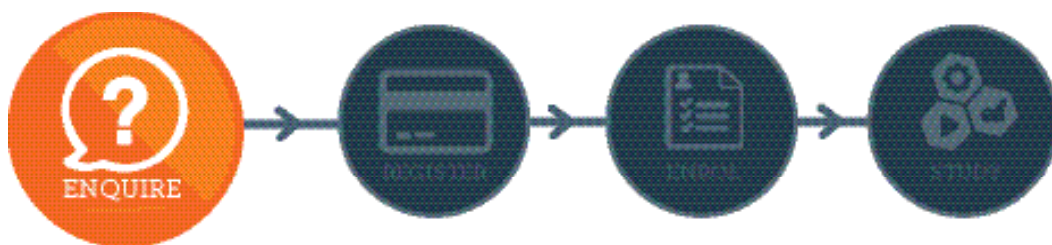
